


Connecting Everett in 2045




GROWTH

Everett is growing—and Everett Transit is growing with it. By 2045, our proposed Growth Network adds 25% more service hours and triples ridership compared to 2023. With frequent 15–20 minute service on key corridors—especially those connecting to future light rail—and expanded coverage in areas like Riverfront and Hardeson Rd, we’re building a system for tomorrow. As Everett adds 70,000 new residents, we’re prioritizing high-demand routes, regional connections, and equitable mobility options. With these changes, nearly 30% more households will have access to fast, frequent service—making transit a smarter, more reliable choice for more people.



SUSTAINABILITY

Everett Transit is committed to a low-emission future—and a resilient one. While we led early with electric buses in 2018, our updated fleet plan reflects lessons learned and today’s realities. We’re now planning a 50/50 electric-hybrid mix to reduce emissions while ensuring reliable service during power outages and extreme weather. Our strategy includes on-site charging solutions, emergency coordination with the City, and future options like hydrogen fuel. With a smarter, cleaner fleet and infrastructure that’s built to last, we’re making sure Everett’s transit system can grow sustainably—and keep moving when it matters most.



SAFETY

Safety is central to Everett Transit’s mission. As part of our Long Range Plan, we’re enhancing how we protect riders, employees, and the community. Our federally required Safety Plan guides regular vehicle inspections, operator training, risk assessments, and emergency coordination. Building on this foundation, we’re expanding security partnerships, upgrading lighting and shelters at key stops, and improving real-time communication tools. With a renewed focus on safety—from daily operations to long-term planning—we’re working to ensure that every rider feels secure, supported, and comfortable throughout their journey.

FINANCIAL

Everett Transit operates with a local sales tax rate of 0.6%—unchanged since 2004. While this funds our current service, it limits our ability to grow and modernize alongside the city.

In comparison, Community Transit collects 1.2%. Had Everett matched Community Transit’s tax increases over the past 22 years, Everett residents would have paid an additional \$310 million toward transit.

A structural funding gap was first identified in 2018, with a recommended increase to 0.9%. Our 2045 plan continues to assume this adjustment in 2030—equivalent to 3 cents on a \$10 purchase. This modest change would support expanded service, improve infrastructure, and ensure Everett Transit can meet the evolving needs of a growing population while maintaining affordability for riders and fiscal responsibility for the community.


